Moderator J. N. Brown, in the Chair. The meeting having come to order, the minutes of the preceding meeting were read and on motion resolved the same were adopted. Members in attendance John N. Brown, Wm Taylor, Wm Stern, Henry A. Beck, Jacob Coleman, and P. Eriinger. — Committee appointed to engage W. M. Dowd for Sexton, reported of having engaged him at \$70 per annum. — He reported also of having notified Thos. Anderson the late Sexton, to discontinue his services from and after the 1st day of April next ensuing. — Committee on Session Rooms, made no report. — Committee on Subscriptions for Pastor's Salary reported progress. — Committee appointed to communicate the reply of the Board to Abel C. Thomas, in answer to his request, reported of having performed the same. — Committee of Investigation reported progress. — The report of the Committee appointed to engage Bro. Jacob W. Colladay as leader of the Choir, which was deferred from last meeting, was taken up and read, when on motion resolved that \$100 be strucken out and that \$50 per annum be inserted — Whereupon the report so amended was read and accepted. — The Committee was accordingly instructed to engage Bro. Jacob W. Colladay for that amount. — Messrs H. A. Beck & J. M. Bill for Civic furnished to the Church, amounting to \$79⁷/₁₀₀, were read and on motion resolved, the same was ordered to be paid. The application of Chas. M. Miller, for the use of the Church, to hold a concert of music was read, when on motion resolved that the request application be not granted. — On motion the Board was adjourned

character and of sober & industrious habits - He has offered to accept the same
for Twenty Dollars per annum. The report being accepted, it was on motion resolved that the
Committee be authorized to engage Mr. Mc Dowell at \$70 per annum, for one year, to be paid
quarterly; under the consideration of his not sailing, to be liable of being discontinued at
any time by the board. A communication from Bro. A. C. Thomas, was presented
to the Board, asking for a contribution of \$100 - to go, to the liquidating of the debt, incurred
by the Society at Lombard St. in the improvement of their "Old Temple of Truth" - when

our generosity, which is a source of much regret to us. Whereupon the Secretary was
appointed said Committee; The following Preamble and Resolutions, offered
by Andrew Miller, was read and on motion the same were adopted, viz:

Whereas it is ordained and established by Article XI of the "Articles of Association
for the purchase of a lot of ground and erecting thereon a house for Divine worship
of the Second Independent Church of Christ, Called Universalists H.C." that the
building erected by the Managers of the Association aforesaid shall be for the
use and behoof of the said Second Independent Church H.C., to hold meetings for
Divine Worship and Church business therein forever, and for the Members of the
said Church to bury their dead in said lot of ground, on such terms as the said
Church shall from time to time prescribe, and whenever said Church shall have
paid to the association aforesaid, the purchase money of said lot, and the cost of erecting
the building thereon to be erected, then the said building and the said lot of ground
shall be conveyed to the said Church freed and discharged from all claims and
trusts whatever! And whereas, it is further ordained and established by
Article XIII of the Articles of Association aforesaid "that the Managers of said Asso-
ciation shall have a right to dispose of the fee simple right to pews in the said building
and to take and receive all pew-rent, and other rents growing out of said building
and all monies that shall become due and payable for the burial of the dead, in
said grounds and the purchase money which shall be received for the fee simple
right to pews in the said building shall form a fund for the purchase of the stock of the said
association and shall be vested therein by the Managers aforesaid in the name of the Mod-
erator of the said Church for the use of the same and the said Moderator shall have
power to vote on such stock H.C." Therefore Resolved, that a committee of three
Members of this Board be appointed whose duty it shall be, to ask permission of the
Board of Managers aforesaid, to examine their Books and papers, for the purpose of
obtaining the following information, viz: 1st. How much money (or stock) has been
received for the fee simple right to pews in the said Church and the names of the individuals
who have paid the same. 2nd. What has been the annual receipts for pew
rents. 3rd. What has been the annual receipts from other sources. 4th. What number
of fittings are now rented and what is the annual price per sitting. 5th. How
many shares of stock of said Association is held by the said Second Independent
Church H.C., and how many by individuals and the names of each individual.

Bill of Andrew Miller for Stationary &c was read and on motion the same was order to be read, amounting to \$26 8⁷/₁₀₀.

Mr. Andrew Miller making the board acquainted of his intention of vacating the leading of the Choir, through his inability of giving his attention regularly - when it was on motion resolved that the singing Committee be requested to procure another Leader, and that Brother Miller be respectfully requested to Continue until another person can be procured.

On motion resolved that a Committee of three persons be appointed to procure another sexton - whereupon William Taylor, Mr. Steene and P. Orninger, were appointed.
