Philadelphia Dec. 21st. 1840.

An adjourned Church Meeting was held this evening at the church. Moderator Mr. Murphy in the chair. Our Secretary being absent, it was on motion resolved that Wm H. White act as Secy. pro tem. The minutes of the last meeting, in relation to the altering of the pulpit, was read in the hearing of this meeting. The Committee appointed at the last meeting - reported "they had examined the present construction of the pulpit, and have concluded that it presents disadvantages, which can be remedied at a small expense. One of the greatest inconveniences, which its present construction presents, is, that the Speaker is compelled to remain in an immediate current of cold air, caused by the rarefaction of air in the church and the presence of the atmosphere without, and thereby jeopardising the health, if not the life, of our pastor.

To obviate this difficulty, the present doors of ingress to the pulpit should be closed, and openings made immediately into the church, and thereby causing the speaker to enjoy an uniform temperature, in common with the congregation. The alteration which your Committee recommends, they have ascertained can be made at an expense not exceeding one hundred Dollars, - Your Committee would therefore offer the following resolution - Resolved, that this Meeting deem it expedient that an entrance to the pulpit be made in the immediate interior of the church, and that the building Committee are hereby authorised to have the same executed without delay.
